The generosity and commitment of our parents and families contribute significantly to the success of the school. We could not accomplish and offer unique experiences to our students without the support of our families.

The **TCA MIDDLE SCHOOL** Covenant agreement includes an obligation and commitment from each family to contribute a minimum of **20 hours** of volunteer time during the school year.

- □ 20 hours for each year of attendance at TCA are required for families.
- □ Friends, relatives and family can assist in fulfilling hours.
- □ In many cases, hours can be scheduled at your convenience (evenings, weekends, etc).
- Hours served outside of TCA in which students participate with parents may count for up to 10 hours of the requirement.
- □ Carpool drivers may count 10 hours for the year towards your volunteer commitment.

- □ Conferences, concerts, sports, and other school events should be included.
- Donations do not count as volunteer hours.
- Hours will be tracked in a notebook kept in the school office. It is your responsibility to log your hours.
- Hours will be reviewed periodically to ensure adequate participation.

The **TCA HIGH SCHOOL** Covenant agreement includes a commitment from each Student to contribute a minimum of **20 hours** of volunteer time during the school year.

- □ 20 hours for each year of attendance at TCAHS are required for graduation.
- Students are required to record and submit hours to the school counselor as completed.
- Volunteer hours will be reviewed each marking period to ensure participation and compliance with the requirement.

TCA Behavioral Policy

(As of January 2019)

When entering Twin Cities Academy, students sign a covenant agreement stating that they will comply with the behavioral expectations of the school. TCA Dress Code/Uniform Policy

Twin Cities Academy is a uniform school; students are to comply with the dress code colors and selected items agreed upon. A reasonable regulation concerning dress, hairstyle, and cleanliness is vital to the individual student and to those with whom a classroom is shared. **School uniforms must be free of brand name logos and designs.** Students must also comply with the following:

- All TCA monogrammed tops must have the current logo.
- Shorts and skirts must meet the fingertip of the middle finger; with relaxed shoulders and straight fingers.
- State law requires that shoes must be worn in a public building.
 - o Religious head-coverings are permitted.
 - o Headbands must be no more than 2 inches wide. Spirit wear headbands sold at TCA.
 - o All Headwear must be a solid color.
- Hooded sweatshirts are **no longer part of the uniform** on any day of the week.
- Undershirts must be solid white, black, navy, or gray.
- HS only: track jackets will no longer be available for sale. Students may wear track jackets with the current TCA logo if owned from previous years.

WHAT NOT TO WEAR! (Not in compliance with TCA's uniform policy)

- Jeans on any day but Friday
- Leggings/Jeggings/Yoga pants/Sweat pants Leggings MAY be worn under skirts and must be black, navy, white, or khaki.
- Baggy or sagging pants
- Bandanas of any color
- Durags of any color
- Headbands/Scarves etc over 2 in. wide and with multiple colors/pattern
- Open toed sandals
- Slides shoes must have a back
- Wedge or high heels
- Flip flops or backless sandals
- Wheelies shoes
- Outer clothing -hats, jackets, etc.
- Sport shorts/Athletic shorts
- Blankets

Students in violation of the dress code will be sent to the office until proper attire is acquired. If behavior continues, students may receive an office referral.

**FRIDAYS ARE SPIRIT WEAR AND COLLEGE WEAR DAY - Students may wear BLUE jeans or joggers on Fridays. Jeans must NOT have holes or rips that are above fingertip length. In addition, they may wear any of the following top options: spiritwear t-shirts (sold at TCA); old maroon/green uniform shirts; old CRISP TCA shirts; TCA sports shirts - both new or old, including STARS shirts; letterman jackets. Students may also choose to wear their current uniform tops. Students may also choose to wear a college shirt on Fridays. This can be a sweatshirt with a hood.

Non-Uniform Day Attire:

On days designated by TCA as "non-uniform" days, students are expected to demonstrate good judgement in their non-uniform choices. All clothing must be appropriate (fingertip length, belly, and chest covered) for school wear. Students found to be wearing inappropriate clothing (as deemed by the school) will receive an office referral and/or be sent home to change, and/or need to have appropriate clothes brought to school.

Physical Education Attire

Students may wear the following appropriate athletic dress during gym:

- Tennis shoes
- Shorts (no wording/displays on backside of shorts)
- T-shirt of any color/logo/etc. that is school appropriate
- Jacket or sweatshirt for going outside in cooler weather

Please be considerate and remember to wash and replace PE clothes weekly, if not more often.

TCA Student Computer and Internet Access Agreement

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

I) Acceptable Use

- a) I agree to use TCA's computer services only in support of my education and research consistent with the educational objectives of TCA. I will not download or install software or files or subscribe to bulletin boards that are not related to my educational activities. If I have questions about computer use, I will ask my teacher.
- b) I will respect and adhere to all of the rules governing access to TCA computing resources and the rules of any other network or computing resource to which I have access through TCA equipment.
- c) I understand transmission (sent or received) of any material in violation of any regulation is strictly prohibited and may violate criminal law. I will not transmit obscene, sexually suggestive or offensive, lascivious, harassing or abusive messages, copyrighted material, or material protected by trademark or as a trade secret.
- d) I will not publish the name, photograph, home address, or telephone number of myself, another student, faculty, or any other person
- e) I understand using TCA's computer equipment for commercial use, product advertisement or political lobbying is prohibited and may be illegal.
- f) I will access only files I have created or files I am authorized to use. I will not change, copy, rename, delete, view, or otherwise access file unless I have permission from the creator.

II) Internet Etiquette

- a) I will be polite and use courteous, respectful language. I will not swear, use vulgarities, sexual, harsh, disrespectful or abusive language in my messages to others.
- b) I will not participate in direct electronic communications such as chat rooms, bulletin boards, and instant messaging.
- c) I will not misrepresent myself or use an alias.
- d) Illegal activities are strictly forbidden.
- e) I understand any transmission, including electronic mail, is not private and that my communications and access will be monitored.
- f) I will evaluate information carefully. As with any research material, I must review it for accuracy and bias.
- g) I will not use the network in such a way as to disrupt the use of the network by other users. This can be avoided by not sending "chain letters" or "broadcast" messages to lists or individuals.

III) No Warranties

- a) I understand that TCA makes no warranties of any kind, whether expressed or implied, for the service it is providing. TCA is not responsible for any damage I may suffer. This includes loss of data, delays, non-deliveries, mis-deliveries, or service interruptions caused by its own negligence or by my errors or omissions.
- b) I understand the use of any information obtained via TCA is at my own risk. TCA specifically denies any responsibility for the accuracy or quality of information obtained through its services.
- c) I understand TCA has no obligation or authority to defend me against any legal actions brought against me by anyone arising from my misuse of TCA computer resources or violations of any U.S. or foreign laws.

IV) Security

- a) I understand security on any computer system is a high priority, especially when the system involves many users. I will notify my teacher if I notice a security problem. I will not demonstrate the problem to other users.
- b) I will not give my user password to other individuals. Any activity associated with my account will be considered my activity. It is my responsibility to protect my account and password.
- c) I will respect network security and not attempt to bypass it. I may be denied access to the network if I am identified as a security risk.

V) Vandalism

- a) I understand vandalism will result in a cancellation of privileges.
- b) I will not maliciously attempt to harm or destroy data of another user, the Internet, or any other network. This includes, but is not limited to, the uploading or creation of computer viruses.
- c) I will treat all equipment with care and respect. I will not have food or drink near any equipment.
