Respect. Optimism. Achievement. Responsibility.

Here at Twin Cities Academy we are the Tigers, hear and see us ROAR! When teachers and students practice our ROAR-ing values throughout the school day, school becomes a better place to be together. People feel safe to open up to each other, and relationships develop. The world of ROAR is the one we want to live in here at TCA.

Let's talk about behaviors that go against our value of RESPECT. Bully-type behavior can cause a ripple in our ROAR values. Bully-type behavior is any that threatens, damages, harms, instills fear, falsely accuses, defames, violates, intimidates, or ridicules any person, group of people, their property, or creates a hostile environment or social isolation. These are from the TCA Bully Prohibition Policy, which you can access <u>here</u>.

When we see behaviors that have this effect, whether the behavior is in person or electronic, we investigate, re-teach, and assign consequences as needed. Bully-type behaviors are often hidden actions. Students and families can help by reporting what you know, experience or observe. You can fill out a bullying report or tell a staff member face-to-face what you know about bullying behavior. Report forms are in the vestibule between the glass doors by the office. You can also report anonymously or with your name. We encourage either kind of report. We want to work in a community where ROAR values are upheld.

Sibling New Enrollments

If your TCA student has a sibling who is not currently enrolled at TCA and you'd like to enroll him/her for the upcoming school year, you'll need to complete an online **Application for 2023-2024 School Year** for the sibling. Sibling enrollment forms must be submitted no later than **February 24, 2023** for your child to be eligible in the February 28th lottery drawing for any open spots in the grade in which you are looking to have them enrolled.




18 or More Days: Excused & Unexcused absences represent lost time in the classroom and lost opportunities to learn.

Missing just 1 day every two weeks can add up to 18 days in a year Absences add up!

10 to 17 Days: Students who are absent an average of 15 days a year miss a year's worth of school by the end of their senior year.

When students miss a day of school, it actually puts them in days behind their classmates

9 or Fewer Absences: Students with good attendance generally achieve higher grades and enjoy school more. *Students benefit and make the most of their educational opportunities if they attend school regularly and on time*

In February many clinics across MN will offer free dental care for children typically ages 3 - 18 years.


HOW ARE APPOINTMENTS MADE?

Cold, Flu, and COVID are Here

(Guidelines for Keeping your Student Home and Reporting Illnesses)


COVID Tests are available to students in the Health Office. Test your student if they are exhibiting **2 or more** of these symptoms...



Test before sending your student to school. Check your student's temperature in the morning prior to any cold medication you may give them, to ensure they are not feverish before sending them to school.

Students should **not** be in school if they are running a temperature, have vomited more than 1 time, have diarrhea, or have an unidentified rash. If your student is experiencing these symptoms they must be home for 24 hours symptom free without the use of any medications before they can return to school. If your student has an unidentified rash they must have a physician's note before returning to school.

When you call your student in sick, please indicate if the student has tested positive for COVID, or has symptoms similar to that of the flu.






COVID-19 ISOLATION GUIDE For schools, child care, and youth programming


What to do if you are experiencing symptoms of COVID-19* or have tested positive for COVID-19 (regardless of vaccination status or symptoms)

If you were planning to get your Covid vaccines, but hadn't done it yet, you might want to get your rear in gear! The opportunity for free vaccines, test kits and treatments is coming to an end as the end of the Public Health Emergency that was called to stem the Covid tide is eliminated. You might also want to stock up on free Covid kits that are available from the government here: **Free Covid Tests**. It is good to have test kits on hand to utilize after Spring Break before returning to school and prior to visiting those people you love who may be in more fragile health.

COVID test kits, treatments and vaccines won't be free to many consumers much longer







Is it time for you to start thinking about Financial Aid?

You're in luck!



To support local high schools with their financial aid efforts, the Ready, Set, FAFSA! series will again be offered to students and families. Between **Feb. 7–28**, five virtual sessions will cover the financial aid process, details on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), the Minnesota Dream Act for undocumented students, understanding offer letters and how to search for scholarships. *All sessions will have simultaneous interpretation in Spanish, Somali and Hmong.*

Financial aid experts from local colleges will be available during the events to answer questions in the chat. Students who attend or watch a session recording will be eligible to win a \$500 scholarship. **Registration is open now for families on the <u>Ready, Set, FAFSA! website</u>**.

TCA will be having **Board Elections** towards the end of April, and we are looking for both **parent** and **community** board members.

The other is uncontested. TCA also has two open **Community Member** positions, who can be any adult who is not directly connected either by teaching or being a parent of a student at TCA.

We look forward to building a strong school board to lead us into the future.



Does Your Child Have an IEP?

The parents of students who have an IEP are invited to participate in the 2022-23 gathering of the Special Education Advisory Committee at TCA on **February 22 and 23** at TCA.

The gathering, which is more of a consultation than a business meeting, will be held in two parts on the two evenings of Spring conferences. Each evening from 6 to 6:30 p.m., we will discuss the central question of "*Transitions: What can TCA do to help my child get ready for life after High School?*"

Feel free to get supper and bring it with you, or stop by on your way to supper in the cafeteria. A specific location within the building will be announced closer to the date.



*** This 30-hour program will be conducted by a certified instructor from the A+ Driving School and will fulfill the state driver's education requirement. The course will address the "how to" and "whys" of safe driving. The format of the class will be lecture and active discussion.
