People feel safe to open up to each other, and relationships develop. The world of ROAR is the one we want to live in here at TCA.

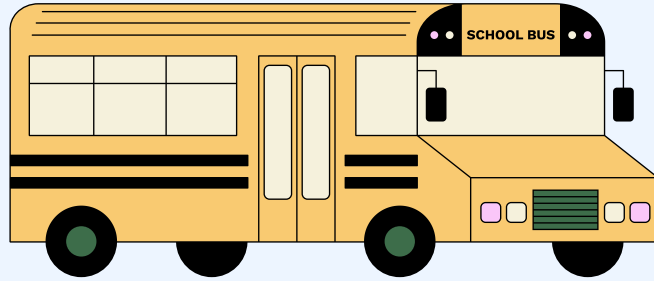
Let's talk about behaviors that go against our value of RESPECT. Bully-type behavior can cause a ripple in our ROAR values. Bully-type behavior is any that threatens, damages, harms, instills fear, falsely accuses, defames, violates, intimidates, or ridicules any person, group of people, their property, or creates a hostile environment or social isolation. These are from the TCA Bully Prohibition Policy, which you can access [here](#).

When we see behaviors that have this effect, whether the behavior is in person or electronic, we investigate, re-teach, and assign consequences as needed. Bully-type behaviors are often hidden actions. Students and families can help by reporting what you know, experience or observe. You can fill out a bullying report or tell a staff member face-to-face what you know about bullying behavior. Report forms are in the vestibule between the glass doors by the office. You can also report anonymously or with your name. We encourage either kind of report. We want to work in a community where ROAR values are upheld.

Sibling New Enrollments

18 or More Days: Excused & Unexcused absences represent lost time in the classroom and lost opportunities to learn.

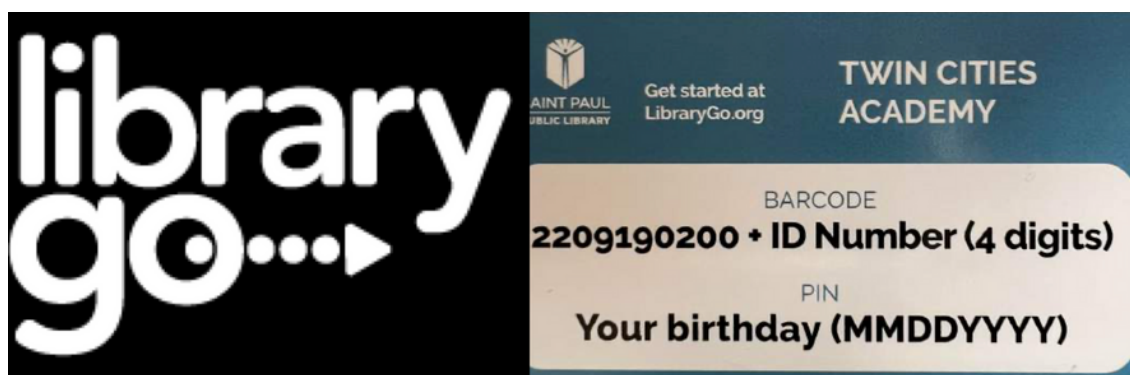
**Missing just 1 day every two weeks can add up to 18 days in a year* Absences add up!*

10 to 17 Days: Students who are absent an average of 15 days a year miss a year's worth of school by the end of their senior year.

When students miss a day of school, it actually puts them in days behind their classmates

9 or Fewer Absences: Students with good attendance generally achieve higher grades and enjoy school more.

Students benefit and make the most of their educational opportunities if they attend school regularly and on time


Applications are available on the portal in Infinite Campus, in paper form at school, or we can also mail an application home with a self addressed stamped envelope.

In February many clinics across MN will offer free dental care for children typically ages 3 - 18 years.

Families can then contact the clinic directly to schedule an appointment. *This program is focused on providing dental care to children who face barriers to accessing dental care.*

Cold, Flu, and COVID are Here

(Guidelines for Keeping your Student Home and Reporting Illnesses)

COVID Tests are available to students in the Health Office. Test your student if they are exhibiting **2 or more** of these symptoms...



Congestion
Coughing
Sneezing
Headache
Fever

Sore Throat
Nausea
Difficulty Breathing
Muscle/Body Aches
New Loss of Smell or Taste

Test before sending your student to school. Check your student's temperature in the morning prior to any cold medication you may give them, to ensure they are not feverish before sending them to school.

*Students should **not** be in school if they are running a temperature, have vomited more than 1 time, have diarrhea, or have an unidentified rash. If your student is experiencing these symptoms they must be home for 24 hours symptom free without the use of any medications before they can return to school. If your student has an unidentified rash they must have a physician's note before returning to school.*

When you call your student in sick, please indicate if the student has tested positive for COVID, or has symptoms similar to that of the flu.

Fever, or feeling feverish/chills
Cough
Sore Throat
Runny or Stuffy Nose

Muscle or Body Aches
Headaches
Fatigue (Tiredness)
Some people may have vomiting and diarrhea, though this is more common in children than adults.



COVID-19 ISOLATION GUIDE

For schools, child care, and youth programming

What to do if you are experiencing symptoms of COVID-19* or have tested positive for COVID-19 (*regardless of vaccination status or symptoms*)

If you have COVID-19 symptoms:



Stay home.



COVID-19 testing is strongly encouraged, especially if you are at high risk for severe disease, if symptoms continue or worsen, if you develop additional symptoms, if you have been exposed to someone with COVID-19, or if COVID-19 transmission is elevated in your area.



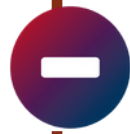
If you do not get tested, follow instructions below as if you had tested positive for COVID-19.



If COVID-19 testing is done and the result is
POSITIVE:

Stay home for a minimum of five full days from the date symptoms started or the date you took the test if you don't have symptoms.

Stay away from others, including household members, as much as possible. Wear a well-fitting mask.



If COVID-19 testing is done and the result is
NEGATIVE:

Stay home until your symptoms improve and you are fever-free for 24 hours (without the use of fever-reducing medication) before returning.

After five days of isolation at home:

Have your symptoms improved and have you been fever-free for 24 hours (without using fever-reducing medication)?

NO:

YES:



Continue to stay home and away from others until **symptoms improve and you are fever-free for 24 hours** (without

using fever-reducing medication). Once both are true, return to school or program and continue to wear a mask when around others, including those in your household, until 10 days have passed since your isolation began.



Return to school or program.

Continue to wear a mask when around others, including those in your household, for another five days.

“Improved symptoms” means that a person no longer feels ill; they can do their daily routine just as they did before they were ill, and any remaining symptoms, such as a cough or runny nose, are very mild, or infrequent.



People who are under 2 years old and others who are unable to wear a well-fitting mask should stay home for at least 10 full days from when they first felt sick or, if no symptoms, from the day they got tested.

If you were planning to get your Covid vaccines, but hadn't done it yet, you might want to get your rear in gear! The opportunity for free vaccines, test kits and treatments is coming to an end as the end of the Public Health Emergency that was called to stem the Covid tide is eliminated. You might also want to stock up on free Covid kits that are available from the government here: **Free Covid Tests**. It is good to have test kits on hand to utilize after Spring Break before returning to school and prior to visiting those people you love who may be in more fragile health.

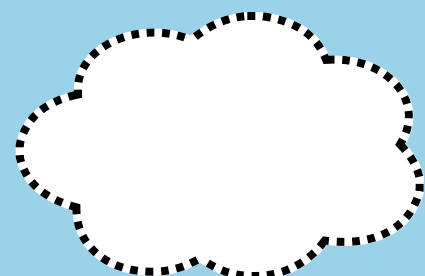
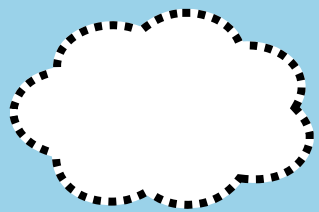

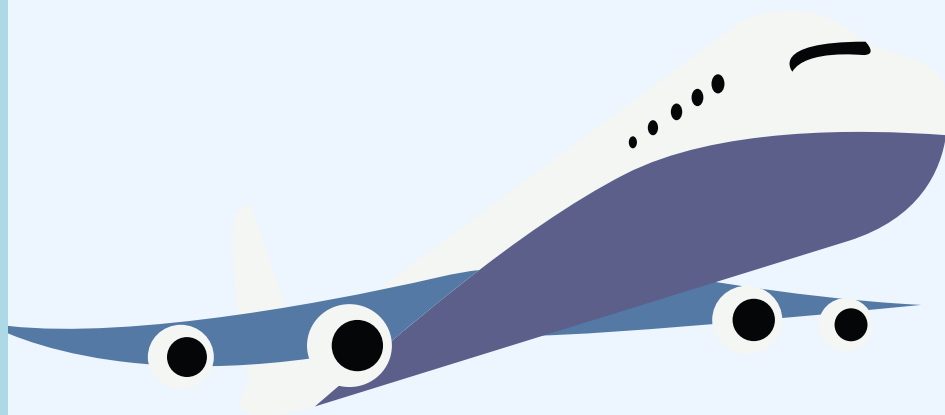

To support local high schools with their financial aid efforts, the Ready, Set, FAFSA! series will again be offered to students and families. Between **Feb. 7–28**, five virtual sessions will cover the financial aid process, details on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), the Minnesota Dream Act for undocumented students, understanding offer letters and how to search for scholarships. ***All sessions will have simultaneous interpretation in Spanish, Somali and Hmong.***

The TCA School Board is looking for Board Members



TCA will be having **Board Elections** towards the end of April, and we are looking for both **parent** and **community** board members.

Board members serve for three year terms and can serve for up to a total of three terms (9 years), if they would like. The school board meets monthly on the fourth Tuesday of the month in the evening from 5 p.m., and all board members are expected to serve on at least one board committee that generally meets monthly for an hour as well.

Parents are defined as any person who is the legal guardian of a student at TCA. TCA has two open parent board seats. Rich Holst, current board chair, will be re-running for one of the seats. The other is uncontested. TCA also has two open **Community Member** positions, who can be any adult who is not directly connected either by teaching or being a parent of a student at TCA.

TCA is looking for board members with for-profit or non-profit financial experience, legal experience or general non-profit experience.

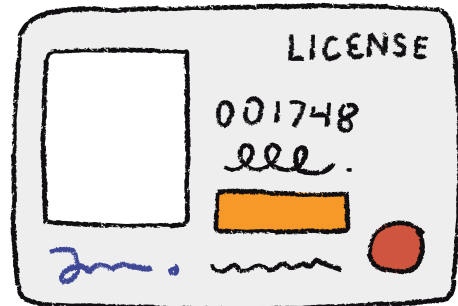

DRIVER'S EDUCATION (Students who are 14 years of age and older)



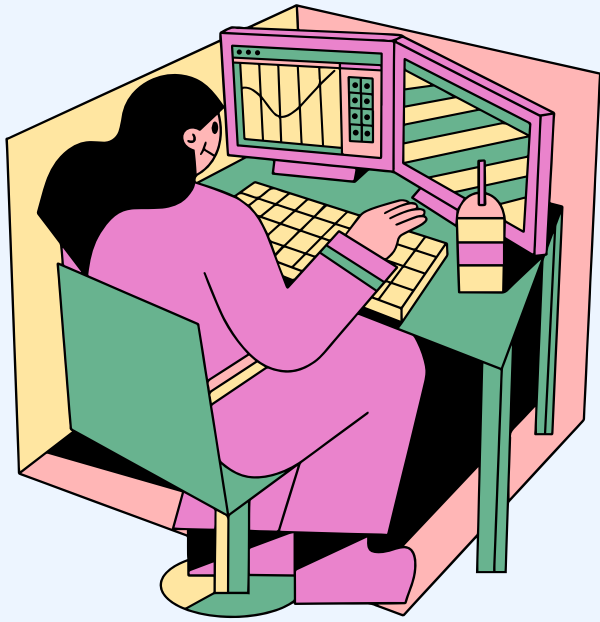
